As I write this we are watching the beginning of the provincial reopening, the roll-out of vaccines, decreases in new case counts and the approach of the return to the normal that will allow the JCCC to reopen.

It has been an exhausting, anxious time for everyone and we really appreciate the countless messages of encouragement, support and goodwill we have received since lockdown began.

The JCCC very much values your membership and it is that membership support that is critical to our ability to flourish. Through your memberships and donations the JCCC was able to serve our community under circumstances we have never faced before.

During that difficult and very busy time we did not send out membership renewal notices. Despite that, many have renewed their memberships and we are very grateful for your thoughtful support. It means a great deal to us.

For those who have seen their membership lapse and been uncertain of the best way to continue membership we would like to make this as simple as possible. Your membership is critical to the JCCC's survival and so we would like to suggest a one-year "fresh start" membership renewal starting April 1, 2021. We will set those lapsed months aside and start anew as we enter this period of recovery. Spring is upon us, the sakura are ready to bloom and our reopening cannot be far away.

We will be mailing out membership renewal forms and we sincerely hope you will consider taking part.

In the meantime we will continue to deliver on the JCCC mandate virtually. Our virtual Haru Matsuri opened the month of March and a hybrid Toronto Japanese Film Festival will be presented both virtually and eventually onsite later this year. An event to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the 3.11 tsunami disaster will held on the 11th as well as a presentation to report on the JCCC Foundation's scholarship program in three Tohoku universities.

To those who were so used to coming to the JCCC weekly to attend our cultural and martial arts classes, the JCCC has been able to provide free Zoom classes for our martial arts students, outdoor practices in the summer months and execute some of our cultural programming online. Our Japanese language group classes resumed in January with 6 classes of all levels being conducted online.

To those who want to stay connected, the JCCC increased the frequency of our monthly newsletter publication, as well as introduced a new monthly bulletin – KOKUBAN online.

To those who are looking forward to visiting the JCCC again when we reopen, we are working to welcome you back with a new exhibit Maru: Immigration Stories in our Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre. We will be announcing the virtual version of the Maru exhibition on Google Arts and Culture very soon.

All this was made possible because of the support the community provided through donations and memberships.

TEN YEARS OF SUPPORTING TOHOKU JCCC Foundation Directs \$1.5 Million to Support Children Affected by the 3.11 Earthquake/Tsunami/Nuclear Disaster

It is a day we will never forget.

On March 11, 2011, Japan experienced the strongest earthquake in its recorded history. The 9.0 magnitude earthquake occurred 30 km below the North Pacific Ocean floor, with the epicentre 130 kilometers (81 miles) east of Sendai, the largest city in the Tohoku region.

The Tohoku earthquake zone of 300km long and 150km wide thrust 33 feet upward from the ocean floor causing a tsunami producing waves up to 40 meters (132 feet) high.

The tsunami also severely crippled the infrastructure of the country. In addition to the thousands of destroyed homes, businesses, roads, and railways, the tsunami caused the meltdown of three nuclear reactors at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant. The Fukushima nuclear disaster released toxic, radioactive materials into the environment and forced thousands of people to evacuate their homes and businesses.

More than 450,000 people became homeless as a result of the tsunami. The combined total of confirmed deaths and missing is more than 22,000 with nearly 20,000 deaths and 2,500 missing.

Three days later on March 14, the JCCC donated \$100,000 to the Japanese Red Cross Relief effort and formed the Japanese Earthquake Relief Fund

(JERF). The JCCC Foundation JERF went on to collect \$1.5 million from the GTA community.

To ensure the maximum impact, JERF focused on three distinctive elements.

1) JCCC Foundation through JERF donated \$100,000 to each of three prefectural governments in the Tohoku Region (Iwate, Miyagi, Fukushima) to assist the educational needs of affected children.

2) JCCC Foundation through JERF donated \$15,000 to the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo to support their 'Hope for Youth' program, a program set up to enable affected Japanese students to come to Canada to study for a period of up to 6 months to enhance language and cultural skills.

3) JERF funded multiyear post-secondary scholarships in the Tohoku Region at three local Prefectural Universities supporting students impacted by the tragedy in order for them to complete their university education. Each prefectural university administered the scholarship program for the JCCC Foundation.

The students attend Iwate Prefectural University, Tohoku University and Fukushima Medical University.

So far over 130 scholarships have been granted with 38 of those going to

medical students in Fukushima Medical School which houses departments of Radiation Oncology, Radiation Disaster Medicine, and Radiation Health Management.

The JCCC Foundation's JERF remains committed to continuing to support those who have suffered through future scholarships and other initiatives.

We were reminded of those terrible days on February 13 of this year when the region was again struck by a powerful 7.3 magnitude quake – an aftershock from the 2011 disaster - which injured more than 100 people and caused widespread power outages.

The JCCC Foundation appreciates the over 4,000 wonderful donors (individuals and organizations) that ran fundraising events and made personal pledges.

Together with the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo we had planned to invite all of the students supported so far by JERF for a celebration of their accomplishments at the Embassy. The event will be rescheduled in 2022 as a result of the pandemic.

The JCCC's motto is Friendship through Culture. We look forward to meeting the many new friends we have created through JERF and wish them the best for happy and prosperous lives.

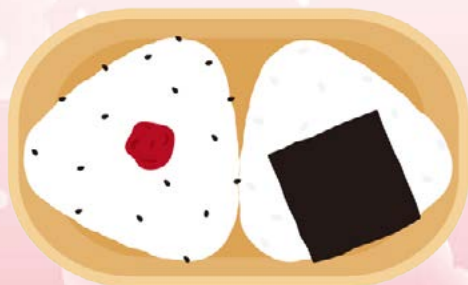
Rice Ball Workshop

Finally, we have a special performance of Rakugo by Ken Saito. If you have never experienced a Rakugo performance, this is a perfect opportunity.

Rakugo is a form of Japanese verbal entertainment. The lone storyteller sits on stage, using only a paper fan and a small handkerchief as props, and without standing up, the rakugo artist depicts a long and complicated comical or sentimental story. The story always involves dialogue of two or more characters. The difference between the characters is depicted only through change in pitch, tone, and a slight turn of the head.

Ken has worked as an actor in Japan and the United States for years. In his early 20's, he went to Korea and Canada to study Korean and English to open up his potential to be internationally active. He continued that pursuit by joining theater companies and eventually going to NY to learn more advanced acting techniques and methods. Following a 2-year program at HB Studio, he started doing English Rakugo performance, trained and directed by Jim Boerlin, one of the legendary professors from HB studio.

This performance will be in English.

This special screening includes a presentation on the \$1.5 million raised by the JCCC Foundation's Earthquake Relief Fund and how it is being used to support scholarships in the Tohoku Region

In 2016 we screened Akane Yamada's moving docu-drama looking at the issue of abandoned dogs in Japan with special reference to those animals lost or abandoned in the days following March 11, 2011. The screening helped raise money for the JCCC Foundation's Japan Earthquake Relief Fund.

We will reintroduce the film online to commemorate this important anniversary with director Yamada providing words of welcome as well as a message updating the story and the real people it documents.

A television director, Kanami is devastated by the passing of her beloved dog Natsu. At the suggestion of a friend, she throws herself back into work and channels her grief into making a documentary about dogs, in particular, the plight of those suffering as the output of unscrupulous "puppy mills" or awaiting adoption – or more likely euthanasia - in overcrowded animal control centres.

Her journey introduces her to some of the exceptional and passionate people dedicated to saving dogs. The members of the Chiba-wan group identify adoptable dogs from among the feral and take them into their homes while searching for potential adopters. She learns of the tireless operators of Hiroshima's Minashigo who took up the cause after the Great East Japan Earthquake Disaster.

A heart-breaking story of compassion, hope and the love we share with our four-legged friends.

上映に先立ち、寄付金総額1.5万ドルを集めたJCCCファンデーション日本地震救済基金(JERF)について、そしてこの基金が東北の被災学生への奨学金制度にいかん活用されているかについて、簡単なプレゼンテーションがあります。

JCCCでは、2016年に山田あかね監督を招き、この「犬に名前をつける日」を上映しました。この映画は、東日本大震災後に避難地域に残された動物たちのレスキュー活動を織り込んだ、名前のない犬たちと彼らを救い出す人々を描いた感動ドキュメンタリードラマです。このイベントでの収益はJERFに寄付されました。

JCCCでは、3月11日にこの映画を再度上映します。映画の後に、山田あかね監督からのご挨拶と、映画のその後について語って頂きます。

2010年秋、愛犬のゴールデンレトリバーを重い病気で亡くした山田あかね監督が、先輩映画監督に促されて「犬の命」をテーマにした映画を撮ろうと思ったことが、この映画の始まりだ。それから動物愛護センターから犬や猫を救い出している人たちや、東日本大震災で置き去りにされた動物を保護している人たちの活動を4年にわたって追い掛け、200時間を超える映像を撮りためた山田監督。『犬に名前をつける日』は、200時間を超えるドキュメンタリー映像に、取材する側＝久野かなみ(小林聡美)を主人公としたドラマを加えたドキュメンタリードラマである。ドキュメンタリーとドラマを融合させることで、犬と猫の命の現場でゆれる取材者の気持ちをリアルに描き出すことに成功している。出演者、音楽、製作者も本作には犬たちを愛するメンバーが集結している。(シネマトゥデイより抜粋)

From Recipes to Archives

Reflections by JCCC's VP of Heritage, Jan Nobuto, on the Valuable Work of the Heritage Department and how it Paved the Path for the Upcoming Exhibit – Maru: Immigration Stories

The JCCC recognizes that the work and stories that have led to the creation of the Japan Diaspora exhibit, Maru: Immigration Stories, began several decades ago when Issei began to tell their stories about their war years experience. It began at first to support Redress and then to let their children and grandchildren know more about their lived war experience in Canada.

For the JCCC's Heritage Department, it began with the Sedai Project. The Sedai Project introduced the importance of collecting and cataloguing Japanese Canadians' oral histories and has now collected over 200 interviews; followed by the 2010 Japanese Canadian Experience Conference: Sharing Our Stories of the War Years (held in commemoration of the 70th Anniversary of Japanese Canadian Internment) that gave participants a glimpse into the personal lives of many internees; and building our network and global connections with other centres and individuals with stories to tell and research to share.

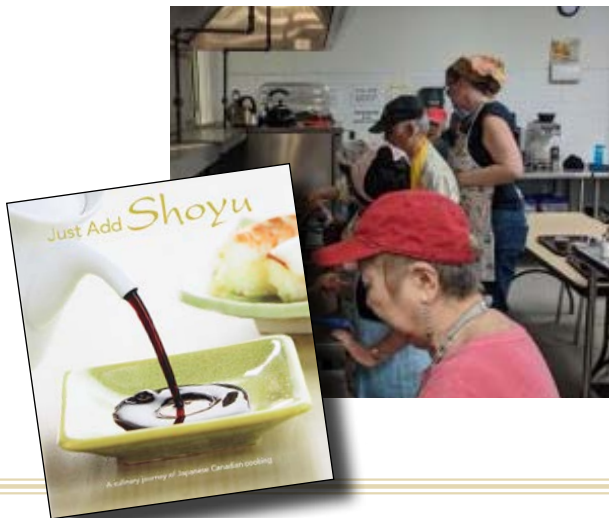
For me personally, it began with working on Just Add Shoyu in 2010, when I had the opportunity to read the stories submitted that talked about personal connections or remembrances of the food their mothers, grandmothers, or great-grandmothers made from the early 1900's to the early 2000's. As I edited these stories and recipes with a group from the Heritage Committee, I learned how ingredients were found or substituted as Japanese Canadians were moved. Most importantly, I learned how Japanese Canadians found ways to

hold onto their food culture through inventive means.

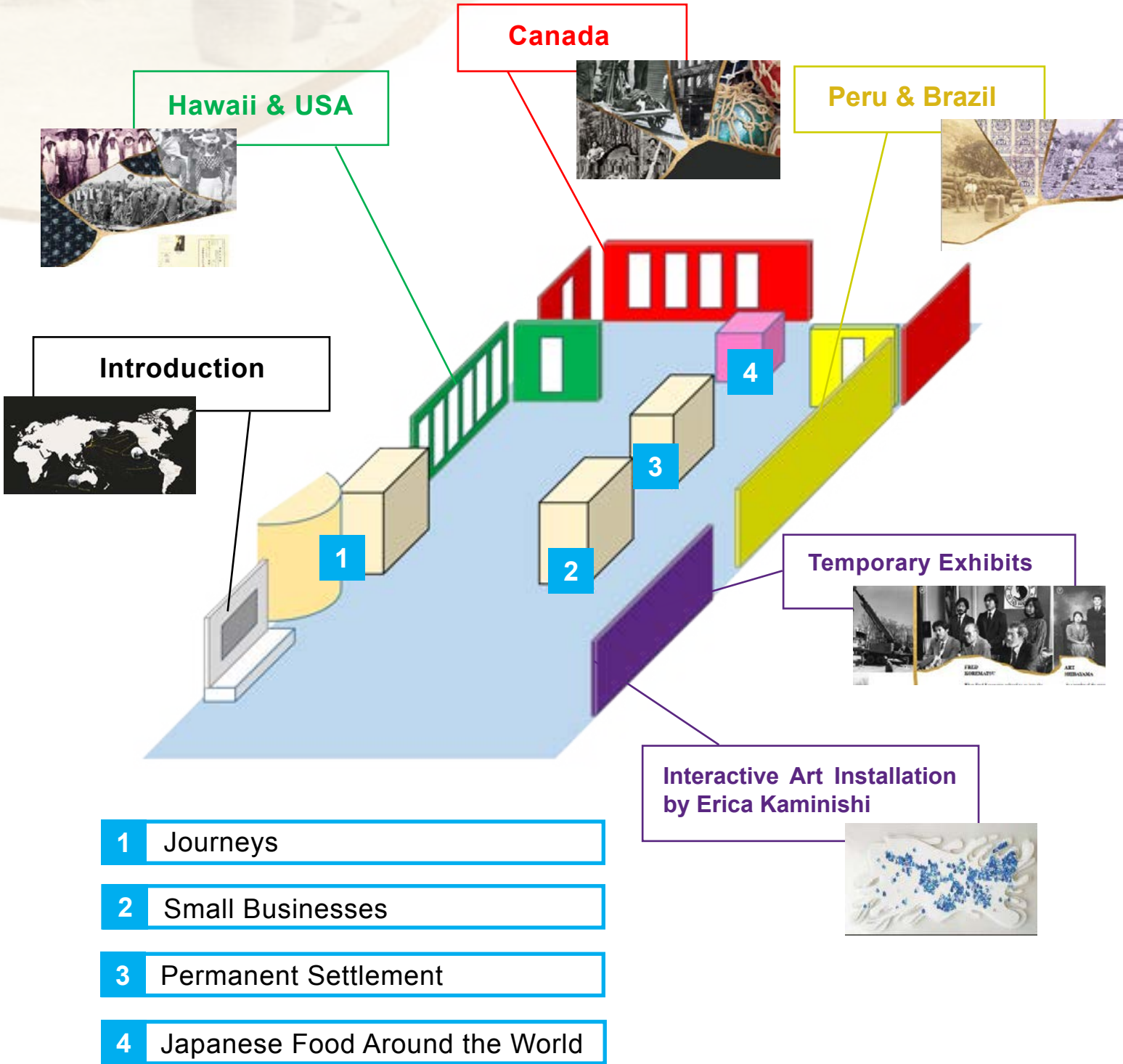
The building of all this information has continued with the archival work of more than two dozen volunteers that have been working since 2011, documenting and cataloguing well over 10,000 photos, artefacts, and documents that have been and continue to be donated to the JCCC's Heritage Department. It also includes the stories and anecdotes that bring to life each item when told by archive volunteers who were there to live the experience or witness the event.

Critical to all the research, development, and planning is the fact that none of this would be possible without the support and guidance of Raymond Moriyama. His financial support in creating the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre and supporting its programming, his forward thinking of the need to be globally connected, his belief in the importance of engaging the learner on multiple levels in multiple ways, and his enthusiastic support for creating a unique and interactive exhibit is second to none. Along with a wonderful Heritage Department team who has worked tirelessly in creating this incredible permanent exhibit, I thank Raymond for all that he has done to support this important work.

I also thank our incredible exhibit team for their creativity, expertise, dedication, and ingenuity and look forward to the opening of the upcoming exhibit Maru: Immigration Stories, which I am sure will excite the community's exploration of the Japanese Diaspora for many years.



Maru: Immigration Stories - Overview

今回、その日本語訳を担当していただいた JP communications のShin Kawaiさんにお話しをお伺いしました。

JC - JCCC, SK - Shin Kawai

JC: いままで様々な翻訳をされてこられたかと思いますが、今回この依頼内容をお聞きになった時に、まず、感じたこと、考えたことなどありましたら教えてください。

SK: 私も戦後移民者なので、このような大切な展示にこうした形で関わらせていただけることを非常に光栄に感じました。

JC: 今回は、世界各地に移民した日系人の話を紹介する文章の日本語訳をしていただきました。今回の翻訳で、ご苦労された点などございましたら、お聞かせいただけますでしょうか。

SK: アメリカ大陸への移民の歴史はさまざまな紆余曲折を経て、現在に至っています。それらを正しく理解した上でわかりやすく、読みやすい日本語に訳す作業にもっとも神経を使いました。この点では、最終チェックをしていただいた編集者の方々に助けて頂きたいへん感謝しています。また、ペルー、ブラジルなど英語圏以外の地域に関する展示も多かったため、正しい団体名などのリサーチなども重要な作業でした。

JC: 文章だけでなく、写真のキャプションや展示品の説明文も翻訳していただきました。特に印象に残った写真や展示品がございましたら、お聞かせいただけますでしょうか。

SK: それぞれがパワフルな写真で、選ぶのは難しいですが、非常に過酷な環境の中で、農業や林業、漁業、店の経営などを通じて、コミュニティを育てていった人たちの写真、表情に最も感動しました。

JC: 丸：日系移民物語の翻訳を通して、日系移民のこれまでの歴史について、ご自身が感じたことや思われたことなどありましたら、お聞かせください。

SK: 戦時中の強制収容など、日系人の歴史は決して平坦なものではありませんでした。差別や偏見と闘いながら前向きに生きてきた移民の人たちの力強さを感じました。

JC: 今回の展示は、多くの日本の方々にもご覧いただけるよう計画しております。展示をご覧になられた方に、ご自身が行われた日本語訳を通して伝えたい思いなどございましたら、教えてください。

SK: 先住民の人たちを除き、カナダは世界中からの移民を受け入れながら成長を続けている国です。私たちが日系移民として今の生活を享受できているのも、さまざまな困難を乗り越えて、今の日系コミュニティを築きあげた先人の方々のおかげです。そうした人たちのたくましい生き様に、できるだけ多くの人に触れていただければと思います。

Maru: Incorporating the JCCC Archive and Collection

When we began planning for Maru: Immigration Stories, we knew that we had an opportunity to display different artifacts and photographs that we have in our collection. The history told in Maru spans over 150 years and across multiple continents. Our collection centres around objects related to Japanese Canadian history. The challenge was to find objects and photographs that would enhance the history being told while paying tribute to our Japanese Canadian roots.

Gestetner style copy machines have been around since the late 1800's. They were a huge advance for the business sector as they could make up to 50 identical copies at a time. Their use continued well into the 20th century. This Gestetner copier was used in Toronto's Japanese Canadian community until the 1980's. Still on the drum roller is a

publication from the Annex listing upcoming community events, including the May 3, 1980 JCCC Bazaar. Artifacts like this one are important as they show ongoing efforts to create and maintain community connections.

In an interesting twist – Archive volunteers Yosh and Jan remember The Gestetner Company having offices at the corner of Don Mills and Wynford Dr, on the property that was intended to be the site of the original Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre. If this geography seems a bit off, you are correct! The original proposed site of the JCCC was at the west end of Wynford Drive. More information on that little piece of history will be in a future newsletter!

A Strong Start for JCCC Online Japanese Language Program

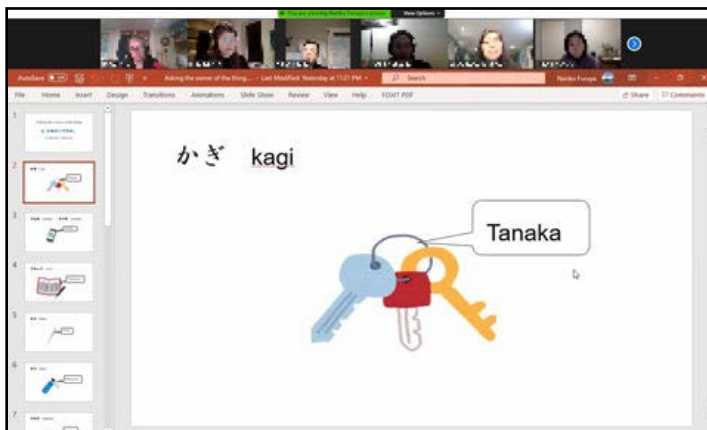

Spotlight on Martial Arts Club

The JCCC is home to 8 different martial arts classes and clubs. Over the next few months we are going to feature our martial arts clubs and explore a little bit more about their history and practice.

Introducing...Jodo 杖道

The JCCC welcomed Jodo classes to our dojo in 2016 under the tutelage of Kevin Hyatt sensei and David Lee sensei (both 4th Dan). While classes are suspended at the current time due to COVID-19 restrictions, they normally operate Tuesdays 9:15 - 10:30pm and Sundays 3:30 - 5:00pm.

The Jo is a cylindrical 128 cm long white oak stick. It was developed from the Bo (棒), a longer and much heavier wooden fighting stick. The founder streamlined the Jo for greater efficiency in close combat against the sword.

The study of Jodo in Canada is a relatively new activity under the Canadian Kendo Federation (CKF). In the mid-1990's, CKF members showed interest in Jodo and invited instructors from Japan to hone the skillset of CKF members. The first CKF Jodo grading was held in Guelph in May, 2000.

Learning Jodo and its Benefits

The main purpose of Jodo lies in defeating the opponent without attacking. The spirit is to not injure the opponent but to utilize the true versatility of its techniques. Jo techniques include: striking, thrusting, blocking, parrying, pinning, and sweeping. All techniques are designed to defend against an attack by a person using a sword.

Students at the JCCC will learn mainly from the Seitei Jodo curriculum; other variations or forms will be shown to students as they progress in their Jodo training.

Learning and studying Jodo is a way of training both your mind and body to improve not only dexterity but also the development of the spirit. The study of Jodo improves one's strength, posture, concentration, balance, coordination and timing.

– Miso Soup – (Serves 2)

The chilly weather has truly arrived as of this publishing, so we thought that this would be a perfect time for our Miso Soup recipe.

Miso Soup can be purchased in ready to eat/just add water packages, but prepared foods can be high in salt. It's so easy to make this soup from our recipe. The added bonus is that you can easily add some vegetables to make it more nutritious. You can also cook up a double batch and freeze it in serving sizes for another meal.



Ingredients

2 cups water
2 heaping tsp miso*
2 tsp dashinomoto
Green onions
210 grams medium tofu, cubed
Optional Vegetables**
 **Thinly slice mushrooms
 **Slivered carrots
 **Match stick daikon
 **1/2 tsp wakame

Equipment

Medium saucepan
Cutting board
Sharp vegetable knife
Small mixing bowls
Measuring cups and spoons
Wooden spoons

Instructions

1. Bring 2 cups of water to a boil. **If you are using the optional vegetables, add them to the boiling water and simmer for 10 minutes.
2. Cube the tofu by slicing into 1/4 inch slices, then slicing into sticks and finally slicing into cubes. Set aside.
3. Trim both ends and any discoloured parts from green onions, then thinly slice. Set aside.
4. To the boiling water add miso and dashinomoto. Simmer for 5 minutes.
5. Add tofu and green onions and serve.

* You can use either white or dark miso depending on how strong you like the flavor.

Storage and Reheating

- Store any leftover Miso Soup in the refrigerator. Store the green onions and tofu separate from the dashi. Leftovers should be eaten or discarded within 3 days. Reheat in a small pot or in the microwave.
- Alternately, leftover dashi may be frozen for up to 2 months. Allow to defrost overnight in the refrigerator, then reheat as above.

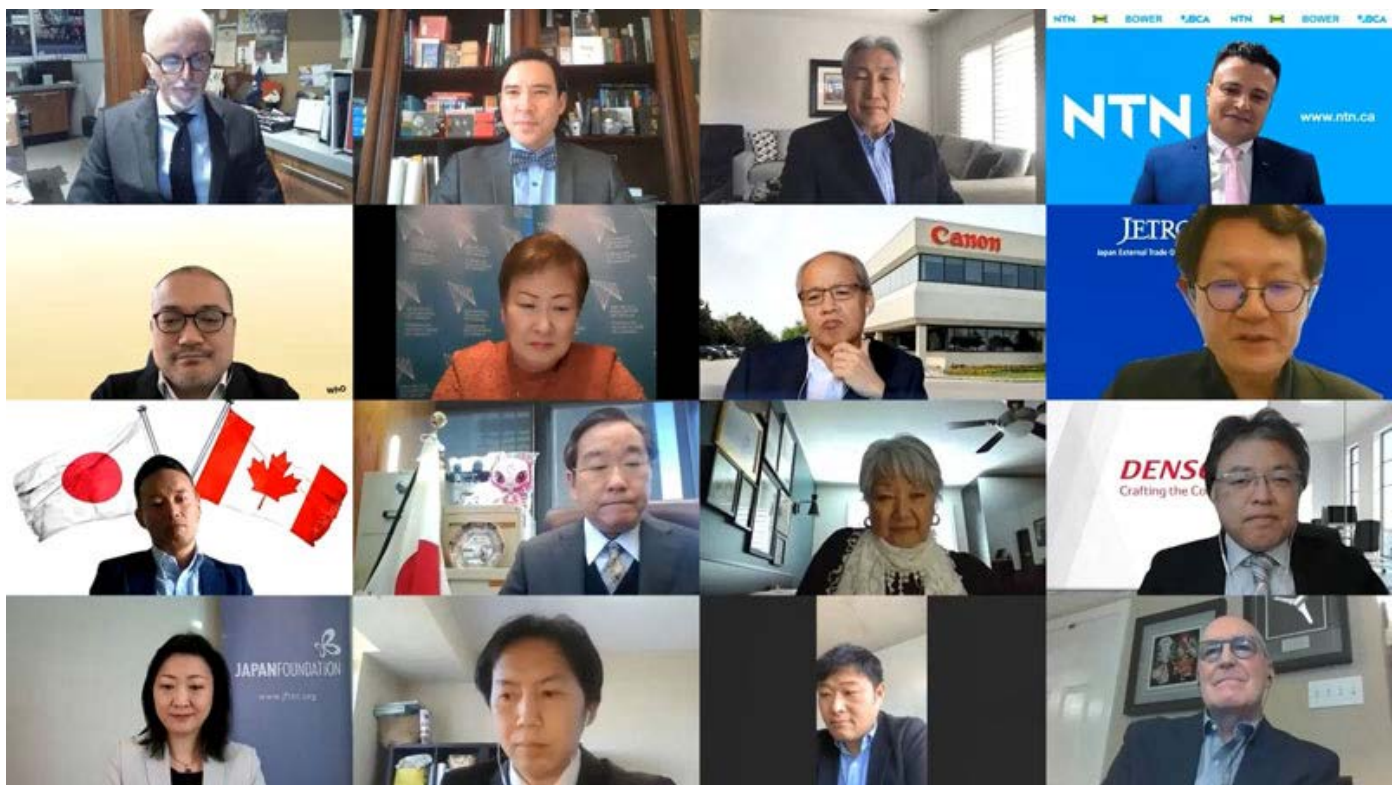

He was a humble man who had great knowledge and technique. For those who only knew him as the kind older Sensei at the club, his modesty and quiet unassuming personality belied the killer left osoto-gari as well as a wicked curveball that he could throw with purpose (ask Russ Sensei).

A talented athlete in his youth, Ken Ikeda was a highly regarded left-handed pitcher who played semi-professional baseball. He was in his mid-twenties when he started judo in the 1950's at the Broadview YMCA as a student of Glenn Kawano Sensei, and his competitive spirit brought him success in inter-club competitions and respect from his clubmates. His judo and baseball time was set

aside though when like many, his priorities had to shift to work and family.

In later years, he took on the responsibility of teaching at a satellite judo club at the Church of the Annunciation in Scarborough and he remained there as the head instructor until it closed in the late 80's, and then he came to help at the JCCC Judo program for well over 20 years.

Although his judo knowledge and skills were very good, in his modest way, he always offered to teach the children beginners and he was a master at being firm but patient. Ikeda Sensei will be remembered as being kind and loved by all students and their families – whether they were beginners who started and stayed for just a few classes or stayed to earn their black belts and every level in between. He was 88 years old.

There will be no funeral. It was Ikeda Sensei's wish that in lieu of a service or flowers, that people could make a donation to the JCCC in care of the Judo program.

Rest in Peace Ikeda Sensei. His legacy lives on in all of his students and their students – and his lesson for all of us is simply to be kind.

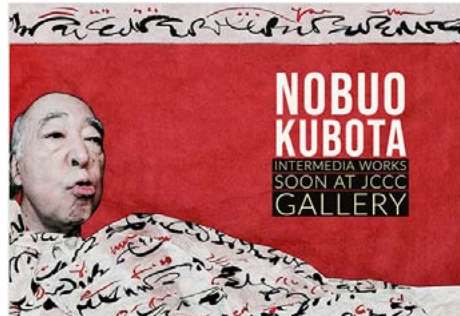
SHIKAKU – Sight, Vision (Virtual Exhibit)

In this space, we will be shining a “spotlight” on one of our many dedicated JCCC volunteers.

Meet Rick Takashima



How long have you been a volunteer here at the JCCC?
I started volunteering in June 1978 so this year marks 43 years.

How did you get involved with volunteering at the JCCC?
In 1978, I had just finished university. I was working nearby in Don Mills and my parents suggested that I help at the Tokyo Pa-

vilion in Metro Caravan. It was the first time I had met so many Sanseis. (I grew up in Etobicoke where I was the only non-white person in my entire grade!) I had so much fun that I started volunteering at more events.

What type of volunteer work have you done?

"I served on the Caravan committee for many years and chaired the committee at least 6 times in the 80's and 90's. In fact, I used part of my vacation each year so that I could spend about 12 hours on-site for each of the 9 days that Caravan lasted. I've also helped with Haru Matsuri, Bazaar and Issei Day almost every year since the 80's. I was co-chair of the JCCC's 25th Anniversary Committee in 1986-87. I also served 3 terms on the Board of Directors in the 80's and 90's (before I became a parent), serving as Treasurer or Vice-President each year. Other events that I volunteered at were Monte Carlo Night (an annual joint venture with the Rotary Club to raise money for Easter Seals), Artisan (an annual craft show) and Road to Asia. I'm also one of the crew of people called upon to help count money after special events. Christine also calls on me when she needs someone to help with the setup of decorations or other prep work for an event.

Also back in the 80's I helped the JCCC purchase its first computer and helped setup the first membership database."

2024年発行開始予定の新1万円札の図案に肖像が採用される渋沢栄一(1840-1931)。第一国立銀行や理化学研究所、東京証券取引所、王子製紙、帝国ホテルのほか数知れない企業や組織の創設に関わった「日本実業界の父」の代表作が『論語と算盤』である。そこに描かれた思想は、いかなるものなのだろうか。本書は、1916(大正5)年発刊の『論語と算盤』のなかから重要部分を選び、漢文調で書かれた原文を平明に現代語訳したものだ。

原書は、渋沢栄一が各地で行った講演の口述筆記をテーマ別に編集した書籍であり、日本の近代資本主義を築き上げた巨人の基盤となった思想や哲学が詰まった名著として知られる。

渋沢栄一は、古代中国の思想家・孔子の言行録である『論語』に傾倒し、自らの生き方、考え方の基礎としていた。『論語と算盤』では、利潤の追求を目的とする企業活動にも、『論語』に著された道德観が必要であるとし、事業経営は社会全体の利益になるべき、と説いている。

火の発見とエネルギー革命、歴史を変えたビール・ワイン・蒸留酒、金・銀への欲望が世界をグローバル化した、石油に浮かぶ文明、ドラッグの魔力、化学兵器と核兵器…。化学は人類を大きく動かしている。人類の歴史は化学とともに発展してきた。「化学」は、地球や宇宙に存在する物質の性質を知るための学問であり、物質(モノ)同士の反応を研究する学問である。

始まりは、人類史上最大の発明とも呼ばれる「火」(燃焼という化学反応)の利用である。人類は火を利用することで、土器やガラスを作り、鉱石から金属を取り出すようになり、生のままでは食べるのが困難だった動物や植物も捕食の対象に加えて、生存範囲を飛躍的に広げていった。現代では、金属やセラミックス、ナイロンのような合成繊維から、ポリエチレンのようなプラスチック類、高性能な電池、創薬などの新しい物質や製品を生み出しているが、いずれも化学の成果に下支えされている。つまり、化学は、火、金属、アルコール、染料、薬、麻薬、石油、そして核物質と、ありとあらゆるものを私たちに与えた学問と言える。

本書は、化学が人類の歴史にどのように影響を与えてきたかを紹介する、白熱のサイエンスエンターテインメント!化学という学問の知的探求の営みを伝えると同時に、人間の夢や欲望を形にしてきた「化学」の実学として面白さを、著者の親切な文章と、図解、イラストも用いながら、やわらかく読者に届ける。

まだ世界で稀だった若年性認知症...

その女性に初めて出逢ったのは、神経内科病棟(日本)で働いていた40年ほど前の事です。今でこそ認知症専門の職場ですが、その頃は脳血管障害、パーキンソン病、脳変性疾患、神経系難病などの治療と看護ケアが中心でした。その当時、認知症は痴呆と呼ばれており、日本は世界一のスピードで超高齢化社会になると指摘されながらも、痴呆に関する人々の意識はどこか他人事のようにだったと記憶しています。

ある日、40代後半の女性Aさんが入院してきました。記憶が混乱し、以前と比べて情緒不安定になったことがきっかけで精査入院となりました。主治医も病棟責任者の私も、Aさんに何が起きているのか全くわかりませんでした!主治医は日本における症例を探り、さらに世界中の文献を分析しました。夕方になると「家に帰る」と言って、荷物を持って廊下を歩く彼女...受け持ちナースは根気強く共に歩きました。その内に夕食が配膳される時間になり「歩いたからお腹が空いたわね。さあ、ご飯を食べましょう!」と病室へ戻ってくる日々が続きました。

痴呆(認知症)専門医でさえその病名がわからない未知の症例でした。彼はカギとなる海外文献をやっと見出しました!そこには「稀ではあるが、若年者でも痴呆症状を呈する症例がある」ことを示していました。今では当たり前のように耳にする「アルツハイマー型認知症」です。しかし「若年性アルツハイマー型認知症」という確たる診断名が世界で用いられるようになったのは、Aさんの入院よりず〜と後のことです...

治療方法も看護ケア方法も全くわかりません。主治医とナースによる合同カンファレンスを行い「訴えに耳を傾ける、一緒に考える、一緒に歩く、同室患者に理解してもらい

協力をえる」ことにしました。もし、私(あなた)が“記憶があやふやになる、自分の心が混乱する”等の状況に陥ったら、それは耐えがたい恐怖に違いありません。そう考えると、彼女の想いや行動に寄り添うしか私たちに手立てがなかったのです。「今、荷物を持って出て行ったよ!」と同室患者からナースコールがあり、直ぐに病棟中を探したこともありました。

ある土曜日、私の自宅に日勤ナースから「豊澤主任、Aさんの親戚が訪れて、週末外泊を望んでいます。よく知っている方のようで、Aさんも外泊を喜んでます」と電話がありました。Aさんは専門医のいる県外の病院までやってきており、家族は諸々の事情で面会がままならない状況でした。入院して以降のAさんの孤独と不安と混乱の日々を想って、私は心からほっとしました。

さて月曜日の朝、全ての患者の巡回を行っていました。夜勤ナースの申し送りだけではなく、実際に患者を診て、話し、必要事項をチェックするのが私の仕事の始まりでした。スタッフとのカンファレンスにおいて、適切なコメントやアドバイスを導くために大事な日課だったのです。管理職ナースとして教育指導に努力していた事の1つでした。

次の病室へ移動するために廊下に出た時、病棟入口にAさんと男性が帰ってきました。私は思わず彼女に走り寄り「Aさん、良かったわね!病院を離れてゆっくりと過ごせる時間をもてて、私も嬉しいです」と抱きしめていました。ナースが迎えにきたので、男性に会釈して直ぐに巡回にもどりました。

しばらくしてナースステーションにもどると、ナースが「親戚の方が『あの人は誰?』と尋ねたので『病棟の責任者です』と伝えたら、

びっくりされて『患者のことを親身になって喜び、抱きしめてくれるようなナースにこれまで出逢ったことがない!これで私は安心してAを任せることができる』と、本当に嬉しそうに帰宅されましたよ」と。

神経内科病棟に入院している患者は「自力で呼吸ができない、歩くと転倒しやすい、話すことが簡単にはできない、行動に時間がかかる」等、一般病棟の入院患者とは異なる特性が多々あります。当時、ナースに対する一般的イメージは“テキパキと仕事をこなす人”であり、それを良しとする職場風土でした。忙しく立ち働くナースに声掛けをあきらめたことはありませんか!?日本人はがまん強く遠慮がちなので、経験者は多いのではないのでしょうか。今の日本の病院現場にも変わらない状況があるかもしれません...

私は病棟責任者になった際、スタッフに「朝はまず笑顔で患者と家族に挨拶しよう、ベッドの傍で椅子に座ってゆっくり話そう、トイレまで一緒に歩こう、廊下を急がない、事象をしっかりと観察して考えよう」等の看護ケア方針を伝えました。「立ったまま覗き込むように話すのではなく視線を同じにすれば、視えなかった事や感じなかったことがつかめる、おむつではなくトイレへ行くことが患者の尊厳を守り、身体機能の維持・改善につながる、転倒などの事故から守るためにはよく観察し、共に行動することが大事」と考えたからです。

椅子に座っていればサボっていると見られる風潮でしたから、スタッフは大いに戸惑ったようです。大事なことは看護ケアの質を高めることであり、前例や風潮などクソくらえと思って(ホントに強く願って)いた私は、トップになったことで長い間温めていた看護体制や方法に変更する機会ができたことに心底ワクワクしていました!それまでに誰も経験のない“ナースの自律した意思決定と働き方”はまもなく病院内に知れ渡り、看護部長の締め付け(パワハラ)を招く羽目になるのですが、この話はまた別の折に(笑)。

Aさんとの接し方は、上記の看護ケア方針に基づいたものでした。病名もケア方法もわからない時こそ“その人に寄り添うことが基本である”と学び、また確信することもできました。私にとって、認知症への扉を開いてくれたのは正にAさんとの出逢いでした。現在では、誰もが避けては通れないほど身近な健康課題です。次号からは、認知症について皆さまと共に考えていきましょう。

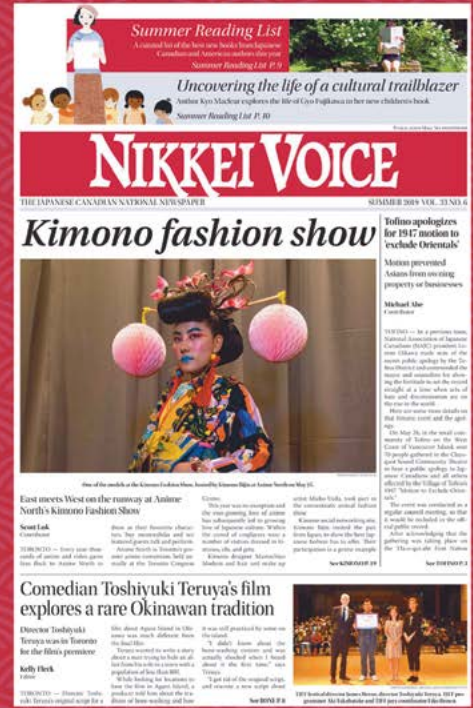
